## “Work Furlough”

Important Notice! As you know, Bishop Jaime Soto instituted a “work furlough” program for the Pastoral Center, including Catholic Cemeteries throughout the Diocese. Effective July 1, 2010, the Pastoral Center and Cemeteries will be closed on the first Friday of every month. The work furlough program will apply to all lay and clerical employees at the diocese.

The following Catholic Cemeteries are impacted by this decision. St. Mary in Sacramento, Calvary in Citrus Heights, All Souls in Vallejo, St. Joseph in Woodland, St Joseph in Sacramento, St. Joseph in Rio Vista, St Alphonsus in Fairfield, Holy Cross in Colusa, St. Patrick in Grass and St. Vincent de Paul in Fairfield, Holy Cross in Colusa, St Patrick in Grass Valley and St. Vincent de Paul in Rancho Murieta.

Cemetery business offices and maintenance yard will be closed. This means there will be no burial or entombment services on the first Friday of each month. However, the Cemetery grounds will remain open during normal posted hours. Cemetery operations and its business offices will re-open Saturday from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. We apologize for this inconvenience and appreciate your understanding.
