Summer Reading.....

For many of us the summer offers an opportunity to catch up on reading. There are two books I would like to share with you. The first is "The Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything" by Fr. James Martin, S.J. author of "My Life with the Saints." His newest book is a wonderful guide to a spirituality of life that everyone can embrace and he has a great sense of humor while offering a great introduction to Ignatian spirituality. Fr. Martin applies Ignatian spirituality to all aspects of daily life--in prayer and making decisions, Fr. Martin also discusses the common expression we hear today "I'm spiritual but not religious"- heard often among young adults.

The other book is "From the Pews in the Back: Young Women and Catholicism" edited by Kate Dugan and Jennifer Owens. The book includes twenty-nine essays written by young women discussing their Catholic identity from many different aspects as they share their journeys from inspiring and energetic to challenging and wounded, and ultimately hopeful. These essays touch on many aspects of life from perspective of these young women (many of whom are in graduate theological studies) as they see and define themselves, their relationships to the Church, and their struggles and joys.
